### April 5 - Easter Sunday

#### The Only Cure that Death Can't Touch

Even the best "pill" for human flourishing cannot stop death - but the risen Christ has. On Easter we celebrate the only cure death cannot touch: the bodily resurrection of Jesus and the certain hope of our own. In His victory we find life, purpose, and a future that no grave can hold.



### April 12

The One who conquered death still enters our anxious places and speaks His peace over us.



### April 19

#### Present with Us

Through His Word and His Sacrament, and by His Spirit, the risen Lord continues to walk with His people, opening our eyes and strengthening our faith.



### April 26

#### Life to the Full

The resurrection is not only Christ's victory over death - it is His promise that life with Him is rich, secure, and overflowing with grace.

# HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SERVICES

Holy Week commemorates the culminating week in the life of Jesus, and the events at the heart of the salvation which is ours through Him.



### Maundy Thursday

April 2 at 7:00 PM

Our service is a commemoration of Jesus' "Last Supper." At this meal, He transformed the Passover meal into a sharing of Himself in bread and wine as His body and blood. At our Maundy Thursday worship, we will also be celebrating the first communion of those who have been preparing to be welcomed to the Lord's Supper.



### Good Friday

April 3 at 7:00 PM

Good Friday marks the day that Jesus was crucified. Our evening service is a Tenebrae Service. This is an ancient and beautiful service of gradually darkening the sanctuary as we read of account of the crucifixion and sing hymns and songs in response, ending with the sanctuary in darkness.



### Easter Vigil

April 4 at 8:00 PM

This is the first celebration of the resurrection and serves as a counterpart to the Good Friday Tenebrae. We process into a darkened sanctuary with candles, and as we meditate on the history of God's saving activity, the sanctuary is gradually lightened.



### Easter Sunday

April 5 at 8:30 AM & 10:30 AM

We will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus with two opportunities to worship. The 8:30 AM service is led with traditional hymns, a chamber ensemble, and the choir. The 10:30 AM service is led by the worship band.

### Easter Sunday Flower Cross

We will continue our annual tradition of having our St. John's families bring flowers to decorate our Easter Sunday flower cross. Please bring a flower or two from your garden to the Easter service. No green thumb? No worries! Store-bought flowers are welcome as well. :)



### Easter Breakfast

The St. John's Lutheran Youth invite you to join us for breakfast on Easter Sunday in the Parish Hall. We will begin serving food at 9 AM and continue to serve through 10:30 AM to ensure that you can enjoy breakfast no matter which worship service you choose. This is a free breakfast, but donations in support of the Youth Ministry are much appreciated!



### Easter Egg Hunt

We'll meet up around 10:00 AM in Faith Chapel for our annual Egg Hunt. Kids are encouraged to bring their own baskets for collecting the eggs that they find.



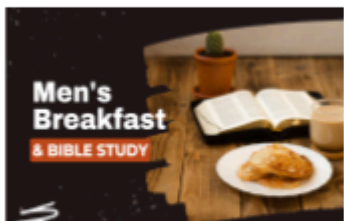
# BIBLE CLASSES AND STUDIES

### Angels and Demons

On April 12 and 26, we will conclude our study of what God's Word says about angel and fallen angels. On these Sundays, we will look at the appearances of angels in the Gospels and Acts, along with selected references to angels in the Epistles. We will study what God's Word says, comparing and contrasting with the views of popular culture, and what it means for us today. We meet in Room 10 each Sunday after worship at 11:00 AM.

# BIBLE CLASSES AND STUDIES



## A Study of the Book of Revelation

The final book of the Bible offers a powerful message of hope to God's people in challenging times. Yet its vivid images, metaphors, and symbols can leave us wondering what they mean. In February we began a three-part study of Revelation that will continue over the coming months.

### Part 1: February 15 (Transfiguration Sunday) - Revelation 1

This year on Transfiguration Sunday, we focused on Christ's glory not as a preview, but as fully accomplished. In Revelation 1, the risen Jesus appears to John in all His resurrected majesty.



### Part 2: Wednesday Worship in Lent - Revelation 2-3

Our Lenten Wednesday worship series, "To the Churches...and to Us," explores Revelation 2-3 - the seven letters Jesus sent to seven churches through John. Each letter speaks both to individual believers and to congregations. What encouragement, correction, and promise do these letters offer to us and to our church today? Our final lesson on the Revelation churches will take place at the Maundy Thursday service.



### April 2 - Maundy Thursday

#### Laodicea: I Will Come In and Eat with You Revelation 3:14-21

Laodicea's lukewarmness meets Christ's persistent love. On this night of the Supper, we hear His promise: "I will come in and eat with you." As we gather at His table, we open our hearts again to the One who knocks and comes in with His grace.



### Part 3: Sunday Bible Class - Revelation 4-22

Starting on May 3, our Sunday Bible class will turn to the remainder of Revelation, beginning with the heavenly vision in Chapter 4. This extended study will continue for several months. Everyone is warmly invited to join us.

All children ages preschool through 5th grade are invited to join us for Children's Church, an age-specific time of teaching and fellowship during the main worship service every Sunday morning.



The children will spend the first part of the service in the sanctuary, then join their teachers for Children's Church in one of the classrooms. ## Endowment Fund Disbursement Application Process

The purpose of the St. John's Endowment Fund is to receive, to manage and to distribute funding to support and implement the mission and vision of St. John's Lutheran Church. The value of the fund is approximately \$1.4 million. Please refer to the Endowment Fund Bylaws on our website for a complete description of what the funds may be used for, and how they are managed.

Each year up to 5% of the value of the fund is available for disbursement to support the ministry. For some of the funds that make up the overall fund, the disbursements have defined purposes (tuition assistance, etc.). The Endowment Fund Committee is receiving applications for 2026 2027 disbursements from the "SJL Ministries" portion of the endowment fund. The last several years, there has been approximately \$36,000 available to be disbursed from this fund.

If you have an idea for a ministry disbursement and would like to submit an application, please visit our website to download an application. **The deadline for applications is April 1, 2026.** Please send or drop off applications to the church office. The Endowment Fund Committee will then review all applications and make recommendations to the Board of Directors.

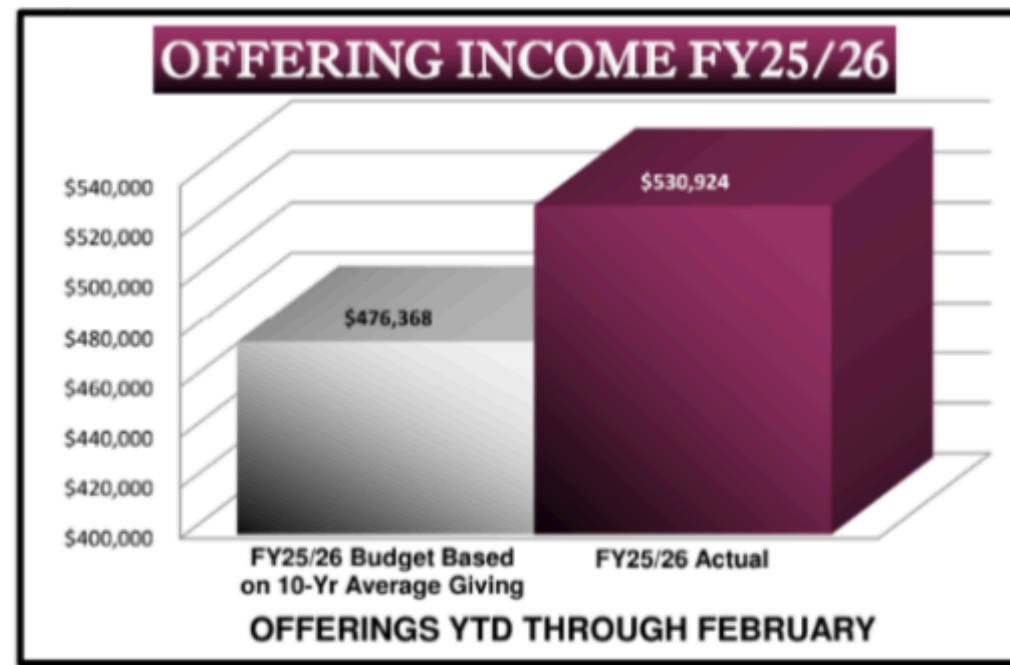

## Our Savior

On Easter Sunday, we celebrate and rejoice in the resurrection from the dead of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. On our behalf, Jesus willingly went to the cross to redeem us from sin and death. "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 15:13) With the suffering and agony of the crucifixion, Jesus has "destroy[ed] the devil's work." (1 John 3:8) In His resurrection, He has given us victory over sin and death.

Alleluia, He is Risen!

As we consider all that the Lord Jesus Christ did for us on the cross of Calvary and in His resurrection, we are compelled to love, honor, and serve Him. The Apostle Paul wrote, "And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again." (2 Corinthians 5:15) In the words of Martin Luther, "Christ has redeemed me from sin, death, and the power of the devil in order that I might be His own and serve Him." As stewards, we respond to the love shown on Calvary because "love so amazing, so divine — demands my soul, my life, my all."

When we give faithfully of our time, talents, and treasures, we demonstrate our love for our Heavenly Father. "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

On Easter Sunday, we consider the best gift given to us by our Redeemer and we praise Jesus for our salvation. Alleluia, He is risen indeed!

Dear Lord, You have taken away the sting of death through Your death and resurrection. You have given me a new victorious life to live in You each day. Keep me steadfast in faith until the end and use me to spread the Good News of victory in Jesus. In His name I pray. Amen.

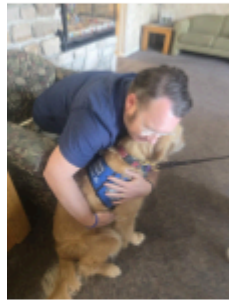

We will reach the two-year predicted wait time in September of 2026 though the date is not guaranteed. We continue to meet monthly, on the first Tuesday of the month at 6:30 PM in Room 10, where we are studying the "Nine Arts of Spiritual Conversation." Our meetings also include prayer time and fellowship. Being a part of this team is like joining together with family.

In March, Tim and Christy Kramer attended an LCC Top Dog Gathering in Illinois to meet with other Top Dogs from around the country to enjoy encouragement, sharing of ideas and processes, and ministry experiences to further enhance each other's ministries. The theme was "Be the salt and the light" focusing on Matthew 5:13-16.

# MISSION FARM

Spring planting has begun in earnest in the fields of our Mission Farm as we are now beginning our 17th year of service to the community. Our mission is to provide fresh produce to financially stressed families through the CANV Food Bank. On Saturday, March 28, melon, zucchini, and cucumber seedlings were planted by eager volunteers. Corn will be planted by seed the following Saturday, April 4th. On a Saturday following Easter, either the 11th or the 18th, tomatoes and bell peppers seedlings (when they are ready) will be planted. Volunteers should arrive at the Farm at 8:30 a.m. We are generally finished by 11:00.

At that latter planting party after Easter, we will observe the Church's ancient custom in spring of gathering in our farm fields to seek God's blessing upon the seed, the soil, and the efforts of the laborers for the sake of a good harvest. While farming and gardening involve our labor and faithful attention to nurturing the plants, a fruitful harvest depends ultimately on the Lord of the Harvest's blessings. You are most welcome to join us with worshiping hands or working hands or both.



# STEPHEN MINISTRY



## The Power of Hope

*May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. - Romans 15:13*

Hope from God is one of the most powerful sources of comfort. Because we know that Jesus rose from the grave on the third day, we have the best reason for hope -- spending eternal life with him! Having Christian hope means that we don't have to place our trust solely in human capacities, institutions, or ideals. Instead, our hope is in God.

Stephen Ministers can be instruments through which Christian hope flows into care receivers. The following are eight practical ways they provide care:

1. **Be consistently supportive** by words and actions, through good times and bad.
2. **Be available** when the care receiver needs to reach out, especially in an emergency.
3. **Empathize**, see the care receiver's situation from his or her point of view.
4. **Acceptance** of the care receiver, without criticism or judgment.
5. **Encourage** the care receiver to look beyond perceived flaws and negatives, to see the good in him- or herself.
6. **Point out opportunities for growth** to help the care receiver recognize where he or she might grow and get stronger.
7. **Acknowledge Jesus' presence** by verbalizing how God is with us in a moment-by-moment basis.
8. **Be distinctively Christian**, remembering that we offer care in God's name, and that Christ is at work in and through Stephen Ministry to bring healing.

None of us can make someone else hopeful – only God can produce that divine reassurance, faith, and confidence that we call hope. God's compassionate presence is evident in the relationship between the Stephen Minister and care receiver.

Please know that YOU matter to God and to the people at St. John's Lutheran Church. God carries you and your problems in His loving hands, and He provides hands-on help through Stephen Ministers. By God's grace we can trust and confide in a Stephen Minister, start to heal, and become whole again.
