

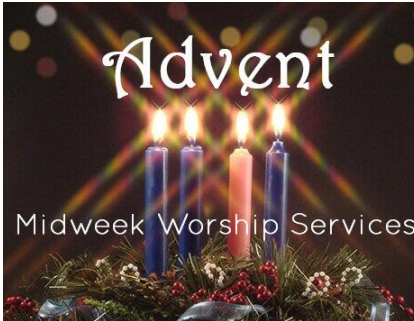

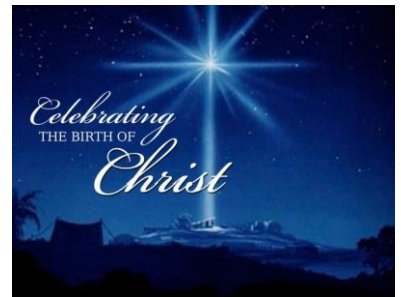
During the season of Advent, we will also offer worship services on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM. Each of the three services is unique with a different focus and style. Each service will also be preceded by a soup supper in the Parish Hall starting at 6:00 PM.

- **December 4 - The Hymns of Christmas, Season 3** – We will take a look at some of our favorite Christmas hymns to sing, along with a brief devotion on each one about the hymn's background and message.
- **December 11 - The ABCs of Christmas:** We will go through the alphabet identifying words and phrases from the biblical account of the first Christmas. The Choraliers will be singing and the Hand bells will be ringing.
- **December 18 –Lessons and Carols:** Led by the Sanctuary Choir. A service of Word and Song, tracing the prophecies of the Messiah through the announcement of His birth.

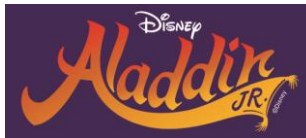


High school hangouts will continue in December on the 1st, 8th, & 15th following the service. 8th graders are welcome to join!

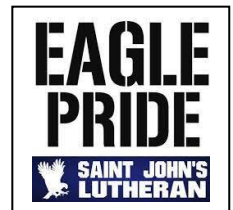

OFFERING UPDATE

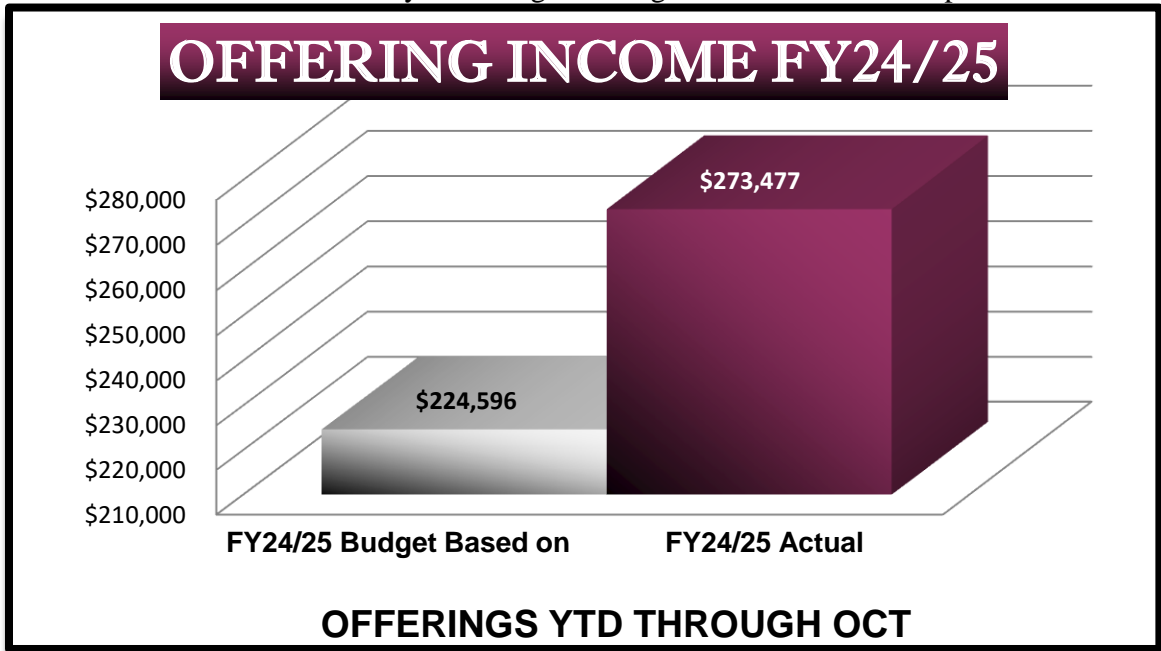
Actual Offering Income for Oct: **\$109,748.**

Meditation:

"...for my eyes have seen Your salvation that You have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to Your people Israel." (Luke 2:30-32)(ESV)

Jesus, the Light

Are you waiting for something that seems to be too long in coming? Maybe it's a job promotion or a raise. Maybe it's just employment of any kind! Perhaps you've been praying for someone's salvation, and you don't see any sign of God's working in that person. It's difficult to wait. People in Jesus' day were waiting for a Messiah. It seemed to many that His coming was long overdue, but Paul writes in Galatians 4:4-5, "*When the time had fully come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons.*" Our waiting is over! The Light has come into the world!

Simeon was one who knew that "*the time had fully come,*" and "*moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts*" (Luke 2:27). There he saw the Child Whose parents brought him there to fulfill what the

Law required of them. Simeon knew Jesus was the light. He proclaimed, “*For my eyes have seen Your salvation . . . a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to Your people Israel*” (Luke 2:30, 32). Unfortunately, not all who were waiting for the Messiah recognized Him when He came. In John 1:4-5 we read, “*In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.*” Still today the darkness misunderstands the Light. Yet He continues to shine, and, as He shines, He dispels darkness.

And He calls upon us to shine also. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, described a lamp that is put on a stand so that it lights up the whole house. Then He said, “*In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in Heaven*” (Matthew 5:16).

The only way to dispel darkness is to fill it with light. As stewards, it is our joyous task to be reflections of Christ’s light. So we are “*prepared in season and out of season: [we] correct, rebuke and encourage – with great patience and careful instruction*” (2 Timothy 4:2). We are always prepared “*to give an answer to everyone who ask [us] to give the reason for the hope that [we] have. And we do so “with gentleness and respect keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against [our] good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander*” (1 Peter 3:15-15). In this way we proclaim that the waiting is over! Jesus, the Light, has come into the world!

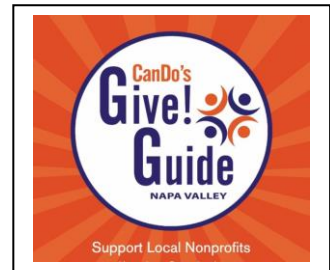

Stephen Ministry: Joy

“I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy...”

Philippians 1:3-4



Such loving, joyful words from Paul in his letter to the Philippians! These words are also heartfelt by our Stephen Ministers as they pray for their care receivers and for each other. Stephen Ministers rejoice in being able to serve others. A common feeling among them is they want to do more, serve more, bring more joy and comfort to hurting people, as they share Christ’s care and love so people can experience hope and healing.

Stephen Ministers are **compassionate**. They are willing and able to share their care receivers’ feelings, and journey with them through their crisis. They often minister out of their personal understanding of what it’s like to go through a difficult time. Stephen Ministers are passionate about this ministry. They care deeply and personally about their care receivers.

Stephen Ministers are **full of faith** as they minister in Jesus’ name. They trust God to provide the courage and love they need to care for their care receivers. They believe that God can and will bring healing and wholeness to their care receivers. They follow their care receivers’ lead in knowing when and how much to share their faith. They trust the Holy Spirit to actively draw the care receiver to Christ.

Stephen Ministers are **skilled** with essential caregiving skills such as listening, understanding and dealing with feelings, maintaining boundaries, and helping their care receivers find more appropriate care when necessary. Stephen Ministers are aware that sometimes they must refer their care receiver to professional caregivers, such as pastors, counselors, or mental health professionals, to meet the care receiver’s need.

Stephen Ministers are **trustworthy** and reliable caregivers. Even in challenging moments, they remain committed to their care receivers and the caring relationship. They maintain confidentiality and are careful to avoid identifying their care receiver. They faithfully attend twice-monthly continuing education and supervision meetings to ensure they and their fellow Stephen Ministers provide the best care possible.
