## Worship in December



### December 7 - Second Sunday of Advent

#### Preparing the Way: Repent!

John the Baptist was called by the Lord to prepare the way for the Messiah. And much of his preparation centered on one word: Repent! Why is repentance so critical for preparing for the Lord? What does it mean to repent? And how does our Lord respond to our repentance?



### December 14 - Third Sunday of Advent

#### Preparing the Way: Believe!

John the Baptist had been arrested for doing what God called him to do. In light of this, is he having doubts? He sends two of his disciples to ask Jesus if He is really the One. Sometimes the circumstances of our lives present a challenge to our faith. Where do we look for assurance and hope when times are hard and God's presence seems far?



### December 21 - Fourth Sunday of Advent

#### Preparing the Way: Obey!

Joseph receives instructions from the Lord that point in the opposite direction from where he had decided to go and what he had decided to do. And yet, he obeyed. Following our Lord's instructions is sometimes difficult, pointing us in directions we would rather not take. But Christ has called us to take His Word to heart and to let it be seen in our lives and actions. In other words, to obey.

### December 28

#### A Clash of Kings

Today's gospel brings us from the joy of Christmas to a horrific tragedy conceived in the twisted mind of King Herod. Instead of singing for joy at the birth of the Savior, Herod struck out in violent fear, committing an atrocious evil upon innocent victims. We are reminded that Jesus came into a fallen world where evil is a present reality. But this is why He came. He came to bring redemption to a fallen humanity, each of our lives tainted by evil as well. Deliver us from evil, Lord Jesus.

### December 3

## Pastor Mike's Bible Class

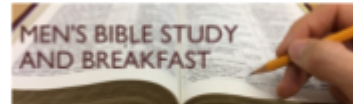
### Angels and Demons

If we take the scriptures seriously, we will acknowledge that there is a spiritual realm and there are spiritual beings all around us that we cannot see. The Bible is full of references to angels as God's servants. And especially in the Gospels, we see Jesus engaged in (one-sided) conflict with demons. In this multi-week study, we're going to look at and discuss what the Bible says about these spiritual beings, how it differs from popular culture, and what it means for us today. We meet in Room 8 each Sunday after worship at 11:00.

### December 21 - Christmas Singalong

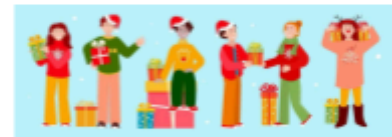

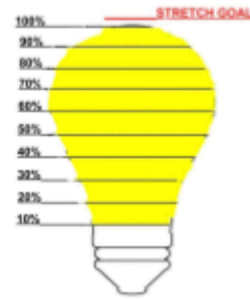
### February 12-14, 2026 - Best Practices for Ministry Conference

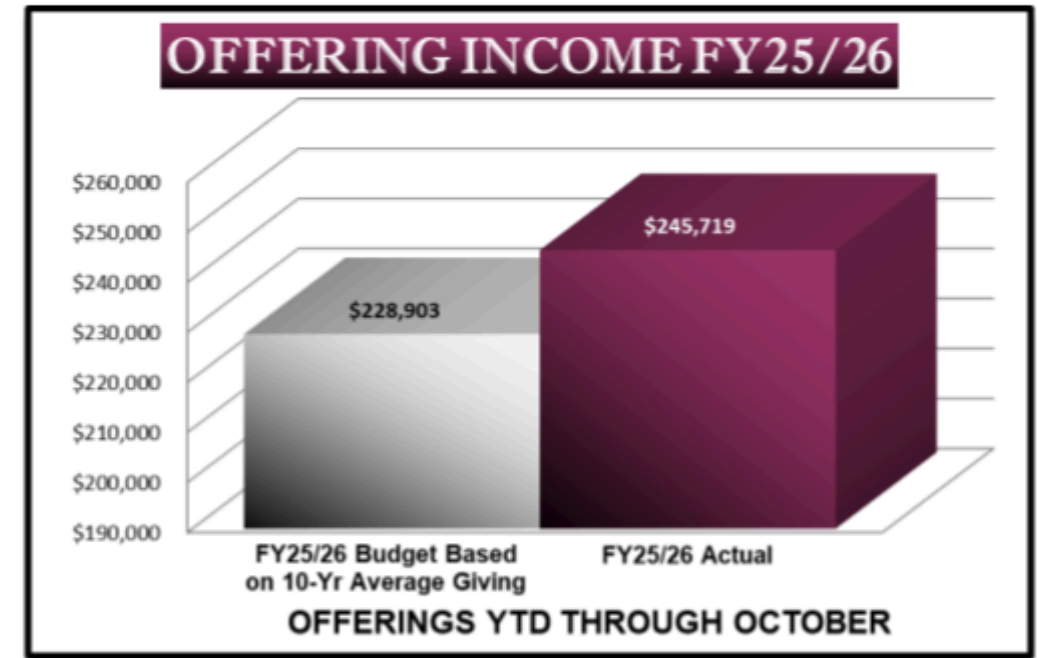

## OFFERING UPDATE

Actual Offering Income for October:	\$68,195.
Total Offerings for FY 2025-26 (as of Oct 31, 2025):	\$245,719, which is 7.35% or \$16,816 above our budgeted offering income.

Total expenses appear to be relatively in line with our budget, and we paid all bills received. \*The budget amount shown below is based on the ten-year average offering received for that time period.

*"But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.'" (Isaiah 43:1 ESV)*

## God's Stewards are GOD's Stewards

This means that God's stewards are stewards by virtue of creation and their re-creation in Holy Baptism; therefore, they belong to the Lord.



# MONEY MATTERS

Stewardship, from the Biblical point of view, is a matter of identity. It's about knowing the One to whom we personally belong. It's about being known by and knowing the Triune God, the God of the Bible, the Lord and Giver of Life, the Creator and Re-Creator of all life — God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The Bible teaches God made us, body and soul, for the present and for eternity for Himself, and even when we wander away from God, deny our being stewards, we still are! God has spoken in and through creation. Vitally important for our understanding of the meaning of life is God has spoken through the redeeming, re-creating, new-life-giving work of His Son; through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Messiah, the Savior, we are restored to new relationships with Almighty God.

The Bible teaches that it is the gracious action of God-in-Christ who accepts, forgives, and makes stewards out of people who are inclined to ignore and even rebel against God. It is a grace-filled response to say, "I am God's steward!" That is a privilege to be valued highly every day of life.

As we reflect on who and Whose we are, on what God has done for us, given to us, our identity is made more sure, more firm — like a loving child learning of being adopted by loving parents. Being identified as GOD'S steward is about our mission, our purpose for living.

As we consider the Biblical basis for this principle, please reflect on the context of each one of the Bible sections or passages listed. There is much to be gained by careful and prayerful reflection on what God reveals to us in the Bible. The implications of saying, "I am God's steward" are enormous. It means we can give credit to God as the source of all gifts, talents, skills, and time that we have. It means that our stewardship involves all of life and that we are discoverers, developers, and deployers of all the gifts God has given to us. Our purpose is to let our life be an offering, a contribution to others in the name of Christ.

Take a close look at Gen. 1; Is. 43:1-3; Rom. 6:1-11; 2 Cor. 5:14-6:2; Eph. 2:8-10; and other references concerning God's creating and redeeming activity. Prayerfully take notes or make journal entries on your thoughts. Share them with others in a group or class and expand on the privilege of being called "God's steward." You are! We are! It is our challenge and privilege to live out that calling, that purpose in daily life. Wow! *God's stewards are GOD'S stewards!*

**Prayer:** Lord, You created me to be a steward. In Holy Baptism, You made me a Christian steward. Guide me in understanding that I am a steward by Your grace and that my stewardship is a way of life. Keep me dependent on You and responsible to You. I ask this for Jesus' sake, Amen.

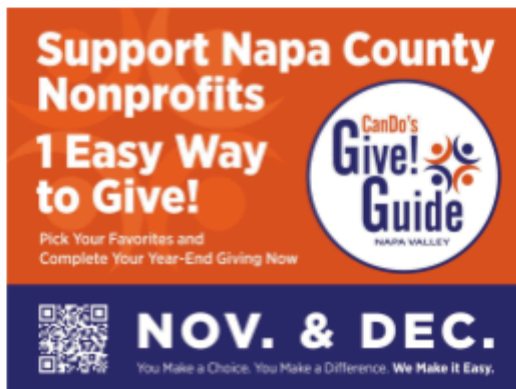
# MISSION FARM

Your money gifts are very important. The gifts of time and energy are “priceless”! Pictured above is one of our regular volunteers making her contribution, weeding the newly planted broccoli and cabbage plants. Given the recent rains interspersed with some sunny days, she will need to do it all over again (hopefully joined by some others). There is a technical side to farming and gardening. There is also a manual side. Don’t worry if you don’t have a lot of experience with gardening. # STEPHEN MINISTRY

*“I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy...”*  
Philippians 1:3-4

Such loving, joyful words from Paul in his letter to the Philippians! These words are also heartfelt by our Stephen Ministers as they pray for their care receivers and for each other. Stephen Ministers rejoice in being able to serve others. A common feeling among them is they want to do more, serve more, bring more joy and comfort to hurting people, as they share Christ’s care and love so people can experience hope and healing.

Stephen Ministers are **compassionate**. They are willing and able to share their care receivers’ feelings, and journey with them through their crisis. They often minister out of their personal understanding of what it’s like to go through a difficult time. Stephen Ministers are passionate about this ministry. They care deeply and personally about their care receivers.

Stephen Ministers are **full of faith** as they minister in Jesus’ name. They trust God to provide the courage and love they need to care for their care receivers. They believe that God can and will bring healing and wholeness to their care receivers. They follow their care receivers’ lead in knowing when and how much to share their faith. They trust the Holy Spirit to actively draw the care receiver to Christ.

Stephen Ministers are **skilled** with essential caregiving skills such as listening, understanding and dealing with feelings, maintaining boundaries, and helping their care receivers find more appropriate care when necessary. Stephen Ministers are aware that sometimes they must refer their care receiver to professional caregivers, such as pastors, counselors, or mental health professionals, to meet the care receiver’s need.

Stephen Ministers are **trustworthy** and reliable caregivers. Even in challenging moments, they remain committed to their care receivers and the caring relationship. They maintain confidentiality and are careful to avoid identifying their care receiver. They faithfully attend twice-monthly continuing education and supervision meetings to ensure they and their fellow Stephen Ministers provide the best care possible.
