# LENT MIDWEEK SERIES

## Lent Midweek Series To the Churches..and to Us A Lenten Journey Through Revelation 2-3

The season of Lent invites us to listen again for Christ's voice. In Revelation 2-3, Jesus speaks to seven churches - calling them to remember, to repent, to endure, and to return. These ancient words still search our hearts and strengthen our faith today. As we walk through Lent, we hear Christ addressing His people with truth and mercy, inviting us to renewed love and deeper trust in the One who walks among His churches still.

### March 4

#### Pergamum: Hold Fast to the Truth Revelation 2:12-17

Pergamum lived in a culture of compromise - and so do we. Jesus calls His people to cling to His Word with courage and grace. What does it mean to stand firm in truth without losing love?



### March 11

#### Thyatira: Guard Your Heart Revelation 2:18-29

Thyatira was a church rich in love and service, yet vulnerable to subtle corruption. Christ invites us to examine the loyalties of our hearts and to hold fast to what is pure and life-giving.



### March 18

#### Sardis: Wake Up! Revelation 3:1-6

Sardis had a reputation for life but was spiritually asleep. Jesus' words are a gracious alarm, calling us to renewal. How does the Spirit revive what is fading and fragile?



### March 25

#### Philadelphia: Hold On to What You Have Revelation 3:7-13

To a small and weary church, Christ opens a door no one can shut. He honors their quiet faithfulness and calls them to persevere. God gives strength to those who feel they have little left.



### April 2 - Maundy Thursday

#### Laodicea: I Will Come In and Eat with You Revelation 3:14-21

Laodicea's lukewarmness meets Christ's persistent love. On this night of the Supper, we hear His promise: "I will come in and eat with you." As we gather at His table, we welcome again the One who knocks and comes in with His grace.



# HOLY WEEK SERVICES

## Palm Sunday

March 29 at 9:30 AM

On this day, we commemorate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, riding on a donkey to shouts of "Hosanna" from the crowd waving palm branches. We will begin our Palm Sunday service in the Faith Chapel (weather permitting) and process into the sanctuary with Palm Branches, praising Jesus. The service will include the Preschoolers singing and the dramatic narrative reading of the account of the passion account.

## Maundy Thursday

April 2 at 7:00 PM

Our service is a commemoration of Jesus' "Last Supper." At this meal, He transformed the Passover meal into a sharing of Himself in bread and wine as His body and blood. At our Maundy Thursday worship, we will also be celebrating the first communion of those who have been preparing to be welcomed to the Lord's Supper.

## Good Friday

April 3 at 7:00 PM

Good Friday marks the day that Jesus was crucified. Our evening service is a Tenebrae Service. This is an ancient and beautiful service of gradually darkening the sanctuary as we read of account of the crucifixion and sing hymns and songs in response, ending with the sanctuary in darkness.

## Easter Vigil

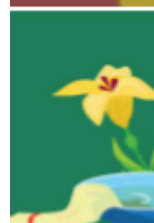
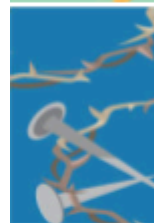
April 4 at 8:00 PM

This is the first celebration of the resurrection and serves as a counterpart to the Good Friday Tenebrae. We process into a darkened sanctuary with candles, and as we meditate on history of God's saving activity, the sanctuary is gradually lightened.

## Easter Sunday

April 5 at 8:30 AM & 10:30 AM

We will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus with two opportunities to worship, at 8:30 and at 10:30. Our Easter morning also includes an egg hunt and an Easter Breakfast in the gym (9:00-10:30).



### Easter Sunday Flower Cross

We will continue our annual tradition of having our St. John's families bring flowers to decorate our Easter Sunday flower cross. Please bring a flower or two from your garden to the Easter service. No green thumb? No worries! Store-bought flowers are welcome as well. :)

## Pastor Mike's Bible Class

### Angels and Demons

This month we continue looking at what God's Word says about angels and fallen angels. Throughout this multi-week study, we're walking through the Scriptures, looking at the times in which angels and demons show up in the narrative, or are mentioned in the writings. ## A Study of the Book of Revelation

The final book of the Bible offers a powerful message of hope to God's people in challenging times. Yet its vivid images, metaphors, and symbols can leave us wondering what they mean. Last month we began a three-part study of Revelation that will continue over the coming months.



### Part 1: February 15 (Transfiguration Sunday) - Revelation 1

This year on Transfiguration Sunday, we focused on Christ's glory not as a preview, but as fully accomplished. In Revelation 1, the risen Jesus appears to John in all His resurrected majesty.

### Part 2: Wednesday Worship in Lent - Revelation 2-3

Our Lenten Wednesday worship series, "To the Churches...and to Us," explores Revelation 2-3 - the seven letters Jesus sent to seven churches through John. Each letter speaks both to individual believers and to congregations. What encouragement, correction, and promise do these letters offer to us and to our church today?

### Part 3: Sunday Bible Class - Revelation 4-22

After Easter, our Sunday Bible class will turn to the remainder of Revelation, beginning with the heavenly vision in Chapter 4. This extended study will continue for several months. Everyone is warmly invited to join us.

All members of St. John's who plan to attend any of our six synodical universities or our two seminaries are eligible to apply. All you have to do is email our Business Administrator Howard Scully at [hscully@stjohnsnapa.org](mailto:hscully@stjohnsnapa.org) announcing your intent to enroll for the 2026-27 academic year.

All applications must include the following information:

- Your name
- School name
- Student ID or account # (if returning student)
- Degree you are pursuing
- Year and level of study (e.g., junior year, undergrad, teacher certification, student teaching, graduate studies)
- Whether you are attending fall term or spring term (or both)
- A brief explanation of why you're attending Concordia and how you plan to use your studies and future vocation to shine the light of Christ and to witness for Jesus as His kingdom representative in the world.

**Deadline for applications is March 31, 2026.** Actual grant amount to each student is undetermined but will be based, in part, upon the number of students requesting assistance. So if you are considering attending a synodical university--even if you have not made a final decision--please send a brief note informing us of where you are in your decision process so that we can plan accordingly.

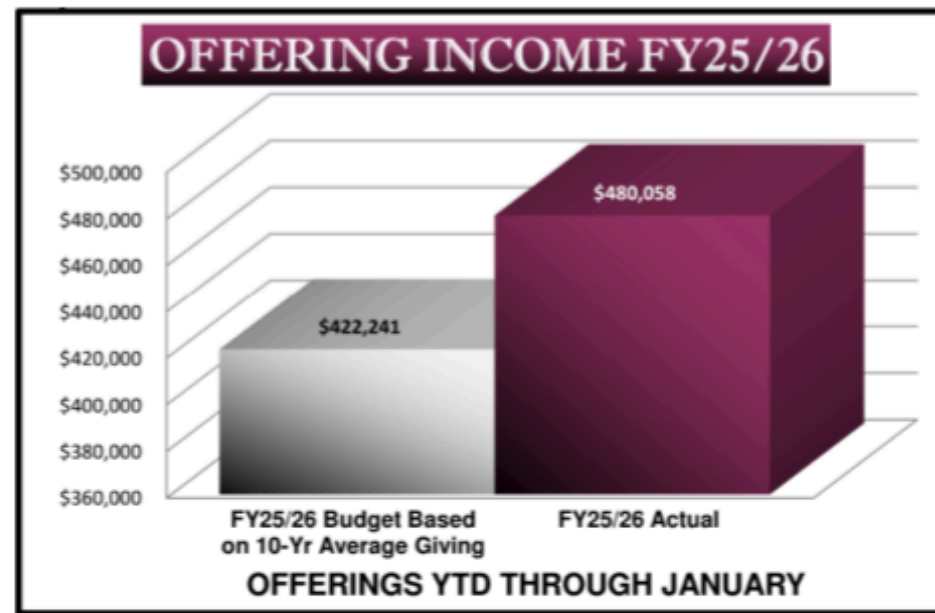
## April 14 - Board of Directors Information Forum

## Meditation:

*"Bring the full tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need. I will rebuke the devourer for you, so that it will not destroy the fruits of your soil, and your vine in the field shall not fail to bear, says the LORD of hosts. Then all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a land of delight, says the LORD of hosts." (Malachi 3:10-12)*

## God Blesses Us for Our Giving

By faith, we understand that the best investment we can make with our money is investing or giving it to God. Throughout Scripture, when a command to give is stated, along with that command is a reference to the blessings that the giver will enjoy. These blessings come in many forms. For example, in Proverbs 11:25, "A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed." In Proverbs 19:17 Solomon tells us, "Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the LORD, and [God] will reward them for what they have done." God has ordained that, when we give generously, we receive generously.

As Christians, we should give without expectation of receiving anything in return. However, our gracious God, who loves us so much, thrills to bless us. He has put within us the joy of giving and finding reward in another's pleasure.

Through Malachi, the LORD offers a double blessing to those who will be obedient in bringing their tithes to the temple. He promises to reward them materially through plentiful harvests. He promises that, if they will honor Him with their tithes, He will prosper them beyond their dreams. Their crops will produce abundantly, and none of their fruit will spoil on the vine. The second part of the blessing is that surrounding nations will see this and realize the special protection that God gives them. *"Test me in this,"* God said. *Are you willing to test God with your earnings? Are you willing to bring your tithes to your church before you pay your bills? Are you worried about the mortgage, the clothes, the groceries, and the transportation? Jesus said, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear... your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."* (Matthew 6:25, 32b-33).

Test Him! *"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously."* (2 Corinthians 9:6). Are you willing to sow generously? You are free to sow generously and then to receive God's promise that you will also reap generously. *"Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you."* (Luke 6:38). It is inevitable that, when you give, you will receive, for that is the way our giving heavenly Father has planned it.

*"Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven. So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do... to be honored by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full."* (Matthew 6:1-2). God pours out spiritual blessings on us when we least expect them. When you are giving out of a desire to obey God's command and to help others, you will find blessings heaped up and running over. These are blessings not understood by those outside the faith.

**Prayer:** Lord, You are the provider and controller of all things. Help me to put my trust and faith in You rather than in worldly things. I thank You for Your wonderful love that was shown through Your Son, Jesus, and all Your wonderful blessings You show to me every day. In Your precious name, I pray. Amen.

# MISSION FARM

Spring is busting out all over! As the picture accompanying this article demonstrates, there are plenty of signs at our Farm we will soon begin a new crop season. Certain steps have already been taken in preparation. On the last Saturday of February, volunteers turned up at Ron and Lois Johnson's backyard to plant seeds in 3" pots so that we will have plenty of nice seedlings to put into the soil when ready. Doing this, we save a great deal of expense rather than obtaining plants from the local nurseries. Dick Lemin will be seen out working more frequently with his partner, Mr. Kubota, tilling the soil so it's ready when the seedlings are.

Also, during March, a new water supply line will be added to the south end of the fields to make irrigation there more efficient. This will be accomplished under the leadership of Liam Johnson as his Eagle Scout Leadership project (under the eagle eye of his grandfather Ron Johnson).

Then on a Saturday late in March (TBD by readiness of seedlings and effects of weather on Dick's and Liam's projects) a workday will be called for many volunteers and interested persons to gather for a time of praying and planting. We are clearly involved in a partnership between us and our major partner, the Lord of Creation, and he is fully in charge of the weather. We propose, and he disposes, for our good and the good of the mission. Before the planting, we will ask him to bless the fields, the seedlings, the planters, the water sources, and to rebuke the devourers so there will be a harvest of blessings for the families in need in our area. Then we will continue to take care of our end of the partnership. Watch for the announcement of the date and join us in praying, planting, fellowship, and devouring some special treats.

## Disability Ministry and Winter Olympics *What do they have in common?*

Why should we be reading a disability ministry article about the Winter Olympics? Weren't the Olympics over in February? In addition, we have already moved on from snow and ice to some sunny days and balmy spring temperatures!

Here is the answer: The 2026 Winter Paralympics is just getting started! The 2026 Winter Paralympics will be held in Italy from March 6-15, featuring 665 athletes competing in 79 events across six sports. The USA will be represented by 70 athletes. The Torch Relay began on February 24, covering 2,000km across five Italian cities, and will enter the Verona Arena on March 6 for the Opening Ceremony!

You may wonder: "What are the Paralympic Games?" It is the largest international event for athletes with disabilities and for societal change. It takes place shortly after every Olympic Games event in the same host city. The Paralympics has grown from a small gathering of British World War II veterans in the summer of 1948 to become one of the largest international sporting events by the early 21st century. The Milano Cortina 2026 Paralympic Winter Games mark the 14th edition and 50th anniversary of the first Winter Paralympics held in 1976.

The Olympic Games are always given great media coverage around the world. In contrast, the Paralympics most often receive little media coverage, and therefore these athletes are given less recognition and honor throughout the country. I would challenge you, as caring people, to expand your Olympic coverage this year by watching some of the Paralympic Games. You might also consider watching some of the events together with your children or grandchildren. You will be amazed by the strength, skills, courage, and character of the athletes who have challenged themselves to shine through their disabilities. I am reminded of Romans 5:3-4, where it says: "...we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope." While these verses specifically speak of our spiritual life in Jesus Christ, we can also apply it to our physical lives and how we face all kinds of challenges.

Too often, society limits the expectations and futures for people who have disabilities. Be a person who encourages and supports the hopes and dreams of others, especially those who have great challenges in their lives! Broaden your awareness of God's gift in each person!

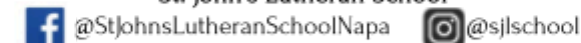
