The law was temporary and preparatory. God's promise in Christ is permanent and inclusive—all are one in Christ Jesus.

September 14

"From Slaves to Sons" - Galatians 4:1-11

We are no longer slaves under the law but sons and daughters with full rights. Don't return to slavery after receiving sonship!

September 21

"A Pastoral Plea" - Galatians 4:12-20

Paul appeals with deep emotion to the Galatians, warning them not to be misled. True shepherds seek Christ formed in others.

September 28

Guest Preacher: Rev. Paul Ferguson

October 12 - St. John's Oktoberfest


Come for the brats, stay for the banter.



Faith Empowers God's Stewards

The writer of Hebrews defines faith: "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see" (Hebrews 11:1). Faith enables us to be God-pleasing stewards. "And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him" (Hebrews 11:6). The eleventh chapter

of Hebrews is known as the "Faith Chapter." From Abel down through the ages, the writer names the heroes of faith, listing their accomplishments, preceding each one with "by faith."

Through faith, we understand that our stewardship is God working in and through us. It is not what we do, not what we give, now how we serve - but what God does, what God gives, how God serves, and our response to His love and gifts to us. God has shown us His plan for our lives. "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). This is the definition of stewardship: doing the good works which God has prepared for us to do. God empowers and equips us to be faithful stewards. God has chosen us to carry out His work on earth. "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit - fruit that will last" (John 15:16a).

It is through faith that our pastor confidently speaks the Word of the Lord. It is God's message, God's gift, and he is the only channel through which it flows. Through faith, the servant humbly steps forward to serve. His only motive is that God may receive the glory as he offers his hands, feet, lips, his whole body, soul and mind in service. Through faith, the teacher diligently prepares her lessons, seeking the leading of the Holy Spirit, studying the Word of God, and looking into the hearts of her students. God creates the learning; His Spirit creates the faith. As stewards, we are the faithful vessels that God uses. Through faith, God can make us into His faithful stewards.

Prayer:

Praise the LORD, all nations! Extol him, all peoples! For great is his steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD endures forever. Praise the LORD! (Psalm 117 ESV)

Two important announcements for this September issue:

First, we are in the thick of the harvest season, and many hands are kept busy, to say the least. In the month of August, we delivered 8,980 lbs. of fresh produce to the Napa County Food Bank. The total poundage for this crop season so far is 14,996 lbs. The produce included corn, tomatoes, cucumbers, bell peppers, jalapenos, summer squash, radishes, green beans, melons, peaches, pluots, plums, and apples. Fall squash will be coming up shortly. Then clean up.

It has been a productive year with well-sized and attractive fruits and vegetables. We are grateful to God for that. We are also very grateful to all the willing volunteers from church and school families that joined us gathering in the harvest. We benefited this year from volunteers from the community as well. They believe in what we are undertaking and willing to support in this way.

Second, the Mission Farm will be participating once again in the Napa Valley GiveGuide Campaign raising funds for our mission. Over 100 not-for-profit organizations will be participating as well. The campaign will run during the months of November and December. We trust you will be generous toward our mission again this year. Watch for more information as the time draws closer.

The Power of Validation

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13

Below is a story to show how a Stephen Minister can care for someone - by listening in a non-judgmental, patient, accepting manner:

After their previous meeting, Andrew (the care receiver) was feeling more comfortable about meeting with his Stephen Minister, Ben. Andrew had started to dig into his difficult feelings about God and Faith, and he was encouraged that Ben had arrived right on time and stayed focused throughout their meeting. Andrew was still uncertain, though, about how openly he should share. Some of what he'd been thinking about his faith got into uncomfortable territory, and he was worried that, if he let it all out, Ben might be shocked and condemn or dispute his thoughts and feelings.

Andrew decided to go ahead and open up - and Ben remained relaxed and understanding. Ben assured him that what he was thinking and feeling was a natural response to what he's been through; it didn't mean he'd lost his faith. That gave Andrew the confidence to go deeper still until he'd said everything on his mind and heart. It felt good being able to say all that while still feeling accepted.

As their meeting ended, Andrew told Ben, "I can hardly believe I could say those kinds of things out loud without being judged. Thanks so much for listening."

Stephen Ministers are trained to listen well. The definition of validation is the process of learning, understanding, believing, and accepting another person's thoughts and feelings about his or her experience - and letting the other person know you've done so, which communicates that his or her thoughts really do matter. Validation builds trust, strengthens relationships, and lets the other person know it's safe to continue sharing.
